 - i. Contract increased from \$7,000 to \$122,000, projected additional \$200,000 next 3 years.

- a. Update on noxious weed designation strategy – Renee and Casey
 - i. Renee attended Colorado Department of Agriculture meeting to categorize species based on levels of invasiveness. Future strategy may take into account botanical records to establish a more accurate statewide noxious weed list.
- b. Tour River Bluffs Open Space Restoration and Resilience Project – Casey and Zac Wiebe
 - i. Overview of River Bluffs Open Space and Poudre River Trail
 - ii. History and pre-project conditions

 - v. Project objectives were to improve riparian and aquatic habitat, create additional wetland, re-connect the main channel to the floodplain, install in-channel features, promote bank stabilization, and establish natural sediment transport cycles.
 - vi. Project design followed a soft-handed approach to restoration utilizing woody structures rather than hard armoring of banks to allow the river to restore itself overtime.
